- 2. The Defendant is hereby ordered to receive, consider and review the "Application for License to Carry a Concealable Weapon" of the Plaintiff for a permit pursuant to RIGL § 11-47-11(a);
- 3. Counsel for Plaintiff and Defendant agree that the Defendant shall have 45 days from the date of this Order to establish policies and procedures for the consideration and review of Applications that are filed under RIGL \$11-47-11(a); thereafter the consideration and

review of the Plaintiff's Application shall take place within a reasonable time not to exceed 30 days;

4. Plaintiff may file the appropriate Motion for the Court to consider in a supplementary proceeding the awarding of attorney's fees and/or costs.
